

VNSO Update Overseas Trade, February 2010

Concepts and definitions for Vanuatu International Merchandise Trade statistics, sourced from the Customs and Inland Revenue Department (CIRD) data system (ASYCUDA), have undergone a major revision as part of the National Accounts Rebasement undertaken in 2009. The definitions for what constitutes an import for home consumption and an export are now consistent with international standards. The data series were reviewed and redeveloped from 1998 to date. There has also been a major improvement in the data exchange system between the CIRD and VNSO which has facilitated the data auditing, and a subsequent improvement in the data consistency checks for the series.

Monthly Trade

According to the February 2010 provisional trade figures, the trade deficit stood at 1,594 million vatu indicating a deterioration of 148 million vatu compared to February 2009 and 22 million vatu when compared to the previous month of January 2010.

In February 2010 total imports decreased by almost 16% from 2,106 million vatu in February 2009 to 1,761 million vatu. This was due to a decrease of 16% in Imports for Home Consumption from 2,101 million vatu in February 2009 to 1,758 million vatu in February 2010.

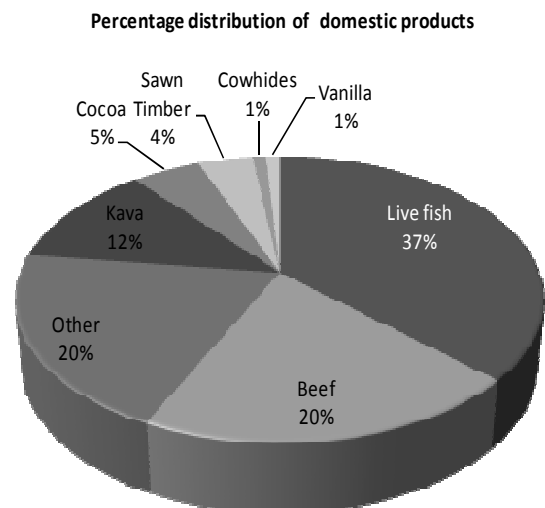
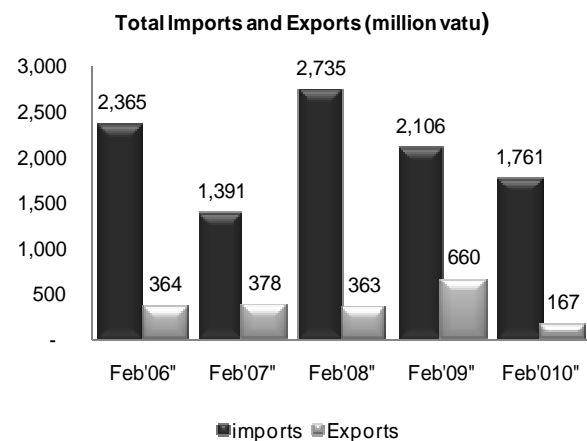
Domestic exports (excluding re-exports) for February 2010 decreased by almost 71% compared to the same period in 2009 from 572 to 167 million vatu. This decrease was mainly attributed to the deterioration in Kava (-57%), Copra (-100%), Shell (-100%) and other exports (-88%).

The improvements in other exports commodities such as live fish (313%), beef (70%), cocoa (60%), and cowhides exports (100%) were not sufficient to offset the deterioration.

Key Commodities

In February 2010, live fish constituted 37% by total value, followed by Beef and other items 20% each, Kava 12%, Cocoa 5%, Sawn timber 4%, and Cowhides, Copra and Vanilla 1% each. Other includes seasonal products such as Citrus, Essential oils, Fresh frozen fish, as well as many other types of items.

In terms of types of items imported, in the month of February 2010, Machines and Transport equipment had the largest value (C.I.F) representing 27% of the total imports for home consumption followed by mineral fuel 20%, Food and live animals representing 18%, Chemical and Basic manufacturing products 11% each. The other groups made up less than 10% each of the total imports for home consumption.



Source of Statistics: The Department of Customs and Inland Revenue provide the VNSO access to their ASYCUDA merchandise trade processing system to derive the imports and exports statistics included here.

Concepts and definitions

- **Imports for Home Consumption** are goods, materials or articles bought in other countries and brought into Vanuatu and cleared through customs procedures for home consumption. Imports for home consumption are valued on a C.I.F. (cost, insurance, freight) basis. This means that for each commodity, the value recorded includes the factory price, the cost of packaging, the freight cost from overseas to Vanuatu ports and the insurance.
- **Exports** are expressed in F.O.B. (free on board) prices. It means the total value includes the production cost and the transport cost to the Vanuatu port of export.
- **Imports for re-export** refers to imports destined to be re-exported without having undergone any transformation, or only minor ones. This is especially the case of duty free goods and fuel “imported” into the country and sold to non-resident airline operators or ships.
- **Re-exports** are goods, materials or articles exported in the same condition as they were imported, and imported goods, which have undergone operations such as repair, repacking, or bottling which leave them essentially unchanged before exporting.
