





#### International Merchandise Trade Statistics-Monthly Provisional Highlights

#### 1. Introduction

International merchandise trade plays a crucial role in economic development, binding producers and consumers located in different countries into a global economic system. The availability of timely, high quality international trade statistics is therefore vital for the analysis of production, consumption, employment, etc. at national and global levels.

### 2. Capacity Development to Improve the Timeliness and Relevance of Trade Data

The Vanuatu National Statistics Office (VNSO) has been part of a mentoring programme offered by the UK Foreign, Commonwealth, and Development Office's Data Science Hub. Data scientists from the Hub have provided mentorship to mentees in VNSO on aspects of reproducible data science. The skills learnt by the VNSO have increased efficiency, free up staff resources, and cut production time of the International Merchandise Trade Statistics Monthly report by 80%, enabling VNSO analysts to concentrate on other areas relevant to Vanuatu's needs.

National Sustainable Development Plan (NSDP) Indicators	The NSDP serves as the country's highest-level policy framework, the indicators provide a system to monitor progress. To report on Trade related NSDP indicators some adaptations have been made. These include ENV 1.3.1 reporting value not volume; ECO 1.5.2 and ECO 1.6.2 reporting on Melanesian Spearhead Group (MSG agreement; ECO 1.7.1 reporting on level of export production of major commodities.
Trade Balance of Major Partner Countries	Balance of trade is the difference between the value of a country's exports and the value of a country's imports for a given period. The Major Partner Countries are Australia, China, Fiji, France, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Japan, South Korea, Malaysia, Netherlands, New Caledonia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Philippines, Singapore, Solomon Islands, Thailand, United Kingdom, and United States of America.
Trade Balance of Pacific Islands (excluding Melanesian Islands, Australia, and New Zealand)	The Pacific Islands included are American Samoa, Tonga, Cook Islands, Kiribati, Federated States of Micronesia, Marshall Islands, Nauru, Niue, Palau, Samoa, French Polynesia, Tuvalu, and Wallis and Futuna Islands.
Trade by Trade Agreement- Melanesian Spearhead Group	The Melanesian Free Trade Agreement (MFTA) aims to achieve regional integration of economies in the MSG. It comprises 4 countries namely Fiji, Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands and Vanuatu.
Major Principal Exports	Major exports are those that account for the majority of export sales. The areas of focus are Beef, Cocoa, Coconut Oil. Copra and Kava. Focus is a time series analysis of current monthly exports from 2011 to 2021.
Top 5 New Major Exports	The traditional VNSO tables report on 13 major export commodities. The rest of the commodities are grouped as 'other products'. This investigates the main commodities within 'other products'.

Top 5 New Major Imports	The traditional VNSO tables report on 47 major import commodities. The rest of the commodities are grouped as 'Other Imports'. This investigates the main commodities within 'Other Imports'.
Imports of Dietary Risk Factors for Noncommunicable Diseases (NCDs)	The Pacific has a growing reputation as having one of the world's highest NCD rates. These major NCDs share four behavioural risk factors: tobacco use, unhealthy diet, physical inactivity, and harmful use of alcohol. This investigates some of the dietary risk factors including Bakery Products, Canned Meats, Confectionary, Cordial, and Noodles.
Imports of Food and Products Targeted as those that can be Potentially Produced Domestically	Import substitution is the idea that blocking imports of manufactured goods can help an economy by increasing the demand for domestically produced goods. The imports of food and products targeted include Canned Mackerel, Canned Tunas, Chicken and Chicken Eggs.


Total value of imports targeted by Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (DARD) as those that can be produced domestically is VT 3.66 million (ENV 1.3.1). The products imported included Potatoes (VT 0.12 million), Tomatoes (VT 0.33 million), Onions and Shallots (VT 0.04 million), Cauliflower and Broccoli (VT 0.30 million), Carrots and Turnips (VT 1.18 million), Capsicum (VT 0.23 million), and Oranges (VT 1.47 million).

The total value of the Melanesian Spearhead Group (MSG) agreement is VT 173.76 million (ECO 1.5.2). This Trade-by-Trade agreement included total exports of VT 104.45 million and total imports of VT 69.32 million. The Balance of Trade by Major Partner Countries is VT -2,455.97 million (ECO 1.5.3). Based on the 2019 Gross Domestic Product (GDP) of

VT 107,450 million, the total estimated value of the MSG agreement as proportion of GDP is 0.16% (ECO 1.6.2).

Level of export production of major commodities is VT 360.01 million (ECO 1.7.1). The major commodities included Beef (VT 29.64 million), Cocoa (VT 49.34 million), Coconut Oil (VT 6.33 million), Coffee (VT 0.89 million), Copra (VT 35.56 million), Kava (VT 146.54 million) and Wood (VT 91.72 million). The ratio of processed export commodities including Coconut, Kava, Cocoa, and Coffee to raw exports is 1.17 (ECO 4.3.2). Total value of processed exports VT 128.14 million, and total value of raw exports VT 109.63 million.

#### ii. Trade Balance by Major Partner Countries



Balance of trade by major partner countries is VT -2,455.97 million. The main countries that account for this Balance are Australia (VT -600.88 million), China (VT -353.44 million), Japan (VT -113.63 million), Singapore (VT -805.14 million) and Thailand (VT -159.37 million). These countries represent 82.76% of the total Balance by Major Partner Countries (VT -2032.46 million).


Major imports from Australia included Machinery & Electrical Appliances (VT 140.86 million); and Prepared Foodstuffs, Beverages, Alcohol, and Tobacco (VT 84.49 million). Major imports from China included Machinery and Electrical Appliances (VT 156.75 million), and Base Metals (VT 91.76 million). Major imports from Japan included Vehicles and Transport Equipment (VT 78.83 million), and Machinery and Electrical Appliances (VT 27.86 million). Major imports from Singapore included Mineral Products (VT 773.01 million); and Prepared Foodstuffs, Beverages, Alcohol, and Tobacco (VT 14.84 million). Major imports from Thailand included Vehicles and Transport Equipment (VT 117.06 million), and Plastics and Rubbers (VT 10.27 million).







## iii. Trade Balance of Pacific Islands (excluding Melanesian Islands, Australia and New Zealand)




Total Trade Balance of Pacific Islands excluding Melanesia, Australia and New Zealand is VT 4.23 million. This was driven by exporting Medicaments to Kiribati (VT 2.75 million), Kava to Samoa (VT 1.01 million), and Steel Bars to Tonga (VT 0.39 million).


The major imports from Fiji included Wheat or Meslin Flour (VT 19.48 million), and Bread, Cakes, Pastry and Biscuits (VT 11.86 million). The major import from Papua New Guinea is Prepared or Preserved Fish (VT 7.11 million), and from the Solomon Islands is also Prepared or Preserved Fish (VT 14.25 million). The major export to Fiji is Kava (VT 71.54 million), to Papua New Guinea Beef (VT 7.84 million), and to Solomon Islands Beef (VT 13.99 million).

#### v. Major Principal Exports



Total value of the Major Principal Exports is VT 267.41 million. The Principal Exports identified included Beef (VT 29.64 million), Cocoa (VT 49.34 million), Coconut Oil (VT 6.33 million), Copra (VT 35.56 million), and Kava (VT 146.54 million). The main country of destination for Beef is the Solomon Islands (VT 13.99 million), Cocoa is Malaysia (VT 43.19 million), Coconut Oil is Fiji (VT 6.24 million), and Copra the United Arab Emirates (VT 35.56 million). Kava is exported mainly to Fiji (VT 71.54 million), New Caledonia (VT 43.00 million), and New Zealand (VT 14.24 million).







The Principal Imports included Alcoholic Drinks (VT 44.00 million), Articles of Iron and Steel (VT 122.34 million), Medicaments (VT 48.49 million), Petroleum Oils (VT 786.76 million), and Rice (VT 59.78 million). The main country of origin for Alcoholic Drinks is Australia (VT 26.94 million), Articles of Iron and Steel is China (VT 56.34 million), Medicaments is Australia (VT 13.47 million), Petroleum Oils is Singapore (VT 771.87 million), and Rice is Taiwan (VT 32.27 million).





Total value of imports targeted by Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (DARD) as those that can be produced domestically is VT 11.59 million (ENV 1.3.1). The products imported included Potatoes (VT 6.95 million), Onions and Shallots (VT 1.99 million), Cauliflower and Broccoli (VT 0.15 million), Carrots and Turnips (VT 1.42 million), and Oranges (VT 1.09 million).

The total value of the Melanesian Spearhead Group (MSG) agreement is VT 330.31 million (ECO 1.5.2). This Trade-by-Trade agreement included total exports of VT 56.30 million and total imports of VT 274.01 million. The Balance of Trade by Major Partner Countries is VT -2,260.11 million (ECO 1.5.3). Based on the 2019 Gross Domestic Product (GDP) VT 107,450 million, the total estimated value of MSG agreement as proportion of GDP is 0.31% (ECO 1.6.2).

Level of export production of major commodities is VT 623.15 million (ECO 1.7.1). The major commodities included Beef (VT 7.52 million), Cocoa (VT 27.94 million), Coconut Oil (VT 11.91 million), Coffee (VT 2.54 million), Copra (VT 21.52 million), Kava (VT 394.10 million) and Wood (VT 157.62 million). The ratio of processed export commodities including Coconut, Kava, Cocoa, and Coffee to raw exports is 4.06 (ECO 4.3.2). Total value of processed exports is VT 366.32 million and total value of raw exports is VT 90.25 million.

#### ii. Trade Balance by Major Partner Countries



Balance of trade by major partner countries is VT -2,260.11 million. The main countries that account for this Balance are Australia (VT -615.51 million), Fiji (VT -278.85 million), New Zealand (VT -362.26 million), Singapore (VT -332.44 million) and Thailand (VT -143.44 million). These countries represent 76.66% of the total Balance by Major Partner Countries (VT -1732.50 million).


Major imports from Australia included Machinery & Electrical Appliances (VT 136.71 million); and Prepared Foodstuffs, Beverages, Alcohol, and Tobacco (VT 103.98 million). Major imports from Fiji included Prepared Foodstuffs, Beverages, Alcohol, and Tobacco (VT 156.28 million), and Vegetable Products (VT 43.23 million). Major imports from New Zealand included Wood, Cork, and Plaiting Materials (VT 89.05 million), and Machinery and Electrical Appliances (VT 52.19 million). Major imports from Singapore included Mineral Products (VT 257.73 million); and Machinery & Electrical Appliances (VT 61.21 million). Major imports from Thailand included Vehicles and Transport Equipment (VT 103.34 million), and Mineral Products (VT 15.42 million).




The major imports from Fiji included Prepared or Preserved Meat (VT 46.20 million), and Bread, Cakes, Pastry and Biscuits (VT 52.94 million). The major import from Papua New Guinea is Prepared or Preserved Fish (VT 3.99 million), and from the Solomon Islands is also Prepared or Preserved Fish (VT 28.70 million). The major export to Fiji is Kava (VT 44.02 million), to Papua New Guinea is Beef (VT 7.52 million), and to Solomon Islands is Medicaments (VT 3.56 million).

The main country of destination for Beef is Papua New Guinea (VT 7.52 million), Cocoa is Malaysia (VT 15.98 million), Coconut Oil is Singapore (VT 11.91 million), and Copra is Bangladesh (VT 21.52 million). Kava is exported mainly to Kiribati (VT 245.30 million), New Caledonia (VT 51.25 million), and Fiji (VT 44.02 million).







Total value of imports targeted by Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (DARD) as those that can be produced domestically is VT 9.48 million (ENV 1.3.1). The products imported included Potatoes (VT 6.79 million), Onions and Shallots (VT 0.18 million), Cauliflower and Broccoli (VT 0.13 million), Carrots and Turnips (VT 1.00 million), Oranges (VT 1.36 million) and Capsicum (VT 0.00 million).

The total value of the Melanesian Spearhead Group (MSG) agreement is VT 352.80 million (ECO 1.5.2). This Trade-by-Trade agreement included total exports of VT 67.52 million and total imports of VT 285.28 million. The Balance of Trade by Major Partner Countries is VT -2,251.60 million (ECO 1.5.3). Based on the 2019 Gross Domestic Product (GDP) VT 107,450 million, the total estimated value of the MSG agreement as proportion of GDP is 0.33% (ECO 1.6.2).

Level of export production of major commodities is VT 190.43 million (ECO 1.7.1). The major commodities included Beef (VT 8.38 million), Cocoa (VT 15.39 million), Coconut Oil (VT 10.84 million), Coffee (VT 1.49 million), Kava (VT 125.10 million) and Wood (VT 29.23 million). The ratio of processed export commodities including Coconut, Kava, Cocoa, and Coffee to raw exports is 0.66 (ECO 4.3.2). Total value of processed exports is VT 60.46 million and total value of raw exports is VT 91.56 million.

#### ii. Trade Balance by Major Partner Countries



Balance of trade by major partner countries is VT -2,251.60 million. The main countries that account for this Balance are Australia (VT -679.43 million), China (VT -258.03 million), Fiji (VT -250.44 million), New Zealand (VT -215.32 million), and Singapore (VT -234.70 million). These countries represent 72.74% of the total Balance by Major Partner Countries (VT -1637.92 million).


Major imports from Australia included Machinery & Electrical Appliances (VT 134.71 million); and Prepared Foodstuffs, Beverages, Alcohol, and Tobacco (VT 167.73 million). Major imports from China included Base Metals (VT 64.72 million), and Machinery & Electrical Appliances (VT 55.28 million). Major imports from Fiji included Prepared Foodstuffs, Beverages, Alcohol, and Tobacco (VT 187.74 million), and Vegetable Products (VT 43.77 million). 



BEC	<b>Broad Economic Category:</b> a classification that groups commodities according to its end use.
CIF	<b>Cost, insurance and freight</b> : includes the transaction value of the goods, insurance and freight to deliver the goods from the border of the exporting country to the border of the importing country.
FOB	<b>Free on board</b> : includes the transaction value of the goods and the value of services performed to deliver goods to the border of the exporting country.
HS	Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System: is a classification of exports and imports of goods. The latest version is '2017' and the custodian of it is the World Customs Organisation (WCO). Vanuatu uses the Vanuatu Harmonized System based off the WCOs HS17. Vanuatu HS is closely aligned to the Pacific HS2017. For HS Sections and Chapters refer to Appendix 3.
