

STATISTICAL UPDATE: PORT VILA CENTRAL MARKET SURVEY

MARCH 2023

Release Date: 30th May 2023

The Port Vila Central Market Survey summarises selected agricultural produces sold at the main wet market based on the Supply and Price of commodities. Data is collected on a fortnightly basis, analysed and published as quarterly average and by commodity groups.

Summary of Findings:


The Port Vila Market Survey of March quarter of 2023 showed an overall Volume decrease of -13 percent on the supply of commodities while the overall price increased by 21 percent compared to the previous quarter.

- ◆ Decrease in the volume of staple produce and Vegetables produce supplied to the market contributed to the decrease in the overall volume index compared to previous quarter.
- ◆ The value of commodities decreased by -12 percent at VT978,000.
- ◆ An average of 153 sellers was recorded for the quarter under review.
- ◆ Market closer in the month of March due to the damage caused by the twin tropical cyclone Judy and Kevin contributed to the overall volume decrease in March quarter of 2023.

OVERVIEW

The Port Vila Market Survey in March quarter of 2023 showed an overall volume decrease of -13 percent compared to the previous quarter. Staple produces and Vegetables produces contributed to the decrease in the overall volume index. (Refer to table 1 & 4).



The overall price increased by 21 percent compared to the previous quarter. Staple produces and Vegetable produces contributed to the increase in overall price index. (Refer to table 2 & 5).



STAPLE FOOD PRODUCES

The supply of Staple food produces decreased by -12 percent when compared to the previous quarter, while the average price increased by 11 percent in the same quarter under review. Commodities that contributed to the decrease in volume were sweet Potato (Kumala) at 831 kilograms, Fiji Taro at 285 kilograms, Yam at 84 kilograms and Green banana at 49 kilograms.

When compared to the same quarter of the previous year, the volume of Staple food increased by 9 percent, while its weighted average price decreased by -10 percent. (Refer to table 1 & 2).



VEGETABLE PRODUCES



The supply of Vegetables to the Port Vila Central Market in March quarter of 2023 recorded an overall decrease of -60 percent and the average price per kilograms increased by 2 percent compared to the previous quarter. Vegetables that contribute to the decrease in vegetables supplies includes, Tomato at -93 percent, Lettuce at -87 percent, Cucumber at -73 percent, Chinese cabbage at -70 percent and Pumpkin at -44 percent. There were no Carrots and Bowl cabbage (White and Purple) sold at the market during the March quarter of 2023.

When compared to the same quarter of the previous year, the supply of vegetables supplied to the market decreased by -53 percent while the average weighted price of vegetables increased by 38 percent. (Refer to table 1 & 2).

FRUIT PRODUCES

An overview of Fruits supplied to Port Vila Central Market in the quarter under review showed an overall increase of 10 percent compared to the previous quarter. Fruits that contributed to the increase in volume were, Watermelon at 59 percent, Green coconut at 18 percent and Pawpaw at 9 percent. The average price per kilograms of fruits produced decreased by -6 percent in the quarter under review.

When compared to the same quarter of the previous year, the quantity supplied of fruits to the Central Market increased by 65 percent and the average price per kilograms increased by 6 percent. (Refer to table 1 & 2).




SELLERS PER COMMODITY GROUPS

March quarter of 2023 recorded a total average of 153 sellers¹ at the Port Vila Central Market which is a decrease of 100 vendors compared to the previous quarter and an increase of 64 vendors when compared to the same quarter of the previous year.

When compared to the previous quarter, Vegetables produce vendors decreased by -71 percent, Staple produce vendors decreased by -24 percent and Fruits produce vendors decreased by -13 percent in the quarter under review.

When compared to the same quarter of the previous year, Staple food vendors increased by 91 percent, Fruit supply vendors increased by 50 percent and Vegetable vendors increased by 89 percent. (Refer to table 6).



¹ This is the total number of sellers at the market. However, one seller can sell more than 1 type of produce hence the analysis by sellers per produce.

Figure 7: Percentage share of Sellers by Vegetables





Figure 8: Share of Value by Produces



VALUE OF SUPPLIES

The average value of commodities at the Port Vila Central Market in the quarter under review recorded a value of VT978,000. This is an overall decrease of -12 percent compared to the previous quarter and an increase of 13 percent in the same quarter of the previous year. (Refer to table 3)

Staple Food registered the largest share in value at 45 percent. The value of staple produces increased by VT16,000 over the previous quarter and increased by VT63,000 compared to the same quarter of the previous year. Fruits produce value registered the second highest share in value at 40 percent. Fruits increased by VT1,000 over the previous quarter and increased by VT143,000 over the same quarter of the previous year. The value of vegetables produce shared the least in value at 15 percent. Vegetables produce value decreased by VT155,000 over the previous quarter and decreased by VT94,000 over the same quarter of the previous year.

CONCEPTS AND DEFINITIONS

The Port Vila Market Survey was instigated to measure the price and volume of specific agricultural produces in the main market. The survey is conducted on a fortnightly basis.

The data analysed in this report shows quarterly average supply and prices of the commodities under study. Weights are based on 2016 using HIES 2010 and Agriculture Census 2007 and were used henceforth.

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
