



## STATISTICAL UPDATE: PORT VILA CENTRAL MARKET SURVEY

**SEPTEMBER 2023**

**Release Date: 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2024**

The Port Vila Central Market Survey summarises selected agricultural produces sold at the main Port Vila Municipal market based on the Supply and Price of commodities. Data is collected on a fortnightly basis, analysed, and published as quarterly average and by commodity groups.


### Summary of Findings:

The Port Vila Market Survey of September quarter of 2023 showed an overall Volume increase of 6 percent on the supply of commodities while the overall price increased by 45 percent compared to the previous quarter.

- ◆ Increase in the volume of Fruits and Vegetables produce supplied to the market contributed to the increase in the overall volume index compared to the previous quarter.
- ◆ The value of commodities increased by 67 percent at VT1.7 million.
- ◆ An average of 191 sellers was recorded for the quarter under review.

### OVERVIEW

The Port Vila Market Survey in September quarter of 2023 showed an overall volume increase of 6 percent compared to the previous quarter. Fruits and Vegetables produce contributed to the increase in the overall volume. (Refer to table 1 & 4).




The overall price increased by 45 percent compared to the previous quarter. Fruits Vegetables and staple produce contributed to the increase in overall price. (Refer to table 2 & 5).

### STAPLE FOOD PRODUCE

The supply of Staple food produce decreased by -34 percent when compared to the previous quarter, while the average price increased by 22 percent in the same quarter under review. Commodities that contributed to the decrease in volume were Yam at -92 percent, Island Taro at -85 percent and Fiji Taro at -54 percent.

When compared to the same quarter of the previous year, the volume of Staple food decreased by -6 percent, while its weighted average price increased by 30 percent. (Refer to table 1 & 2).




## **FRUIT PRODUCE**

An overview of Fruits supplied to Port Vila Central Market in the quarter under review showed an overall increase of 147 Kilograms compared to the previous quarter. Fruits that contributed to the increase in volume were, Water Melon at 501 kilograms, Ripe Banana at 69 Kilograms and Green coconut at 21 kilograms. The average price per kilograms of fruits produced increased by VT216 in the quarter under review.

When compared to the same quarter of the previous year, the quantity supplied of fruits to the Central Market decreased by -41 percent and the average price per kilograms increased by 77 percent. (Refer to table 1 & 2).

Figure 3: Quarterly Volume and Price Indices of Fruits Produces




## **VEGETABLE PRODUCE**

The supply of Vegetables to the Port Vila Central Market in September quarter of 2023 recorded an overall increase of 165 Kilograms and the average price per kilograms increased by 38 percent compared to the previous quarter. Vegetable produces that contribute to the increase in vegetables supplies includes, White bowl cabbage at 507 kilograms, tomato at 331 kilograms, pumpkin at 256 kilograms, Chinese cabbage at 177 kilograms, lettuce at 110 kilograms, bowl cabbage purple at 45 kilograms, cucumber at 40 kilograms and carrot at 38 kilograms.

When compared to the same quarter of the previous year, the supply of vegetables supplied to the market also increased by 195 kilograms and its average weighted price also increased by 51 percent. (Refer to table 1 & 2).

Figure 4: Quarterly Volume and Price Indices of Vegetable Produces






## **SELLERS PER COMMODITY GROUPS**

September quarter of 2023 recorded a total average of 191 sellers<sup>1</sup> at the Port Vila Central Market which is an increase of 33 vendors when compared to the previous quarter and an increase of 10 vendors when compared to the same quarter of the previous year.

When compared to the previous quarter, Vegetables produce vendors increased by 79 percent, Fruits produce vendors increased by 5 percent while Staple produce vendors decreased by 32 percent in the quarter under review.


When compared to September quarter of 2022, Staple food vendors decreased by 23 percent and vegetables supply vendors increased by 60 percent while fruits supply vendors decreased by 60 percent. (Refer to table 6).

### VALUE OF SUPPLIES

The average value of commodities at the Port Vila Central Market in the quarter under review recorded a value of VT1,732,540. This is an overall increase of 67 percent compared to the previous quarter and increase of 84 percent in the same quarter of the previous year. (Refer to table 3)

The Port Vila Market Survey was instigated to measure the price and volume of specific agricultural produces in the main market. The survey is conducted on a fortnightly basis.

The data analysed in this report shows quarterly average supply and prices of the commodities under study. Weights are based on 2016 using HIES 2010 and Agriculture Census 2007 and were used henceforth.

Vegetables produce registered the largest share in value at 56 percent. Vegetable produce increased by VT607,000 over the previous quarter and increased by VT702,000 compared to the same quarter of the previous year. Staple produce registered the second highest share in value at 23 percent. Staple produce decreased by VT218,000 over the previous quarter and increased by VT68,000 over the same quarter of the previous year. Fruits produce shared the least in value at 21 percent. Fruits produced increased by VT309,000 in value over the previous quarter and VT24,000 over the same quarter of the previous year.
